**Relationship and Sexuality Education Curriculum 2025-2026**

Dear Parent/Guardian,

Aware of the important life skills and learning that SPHE provides as part of a holistic education for young people, Salesian College supported the implementation of the updated Junior Cycle Social, Personal and Health Education (SPHE) curriculum which we implemented in Salesian College in September 2023. For the coming academic year 2025-2026, we will also be implementing the updated Transition Year SPHE curriculum as part of the overall new Transition Year Programme Statement (2024) and the new Senior Cycle Curriculum.

Salesian College is satisfied that the redevelopment of the SPHE curricula has been informed by extensive research, by work with schools and education partners, and has been the focus of far-reaching public consultation, including an extensive consultation on the draft curricula.

Deliberations by the members of NCCA Council, its Boards and SPHE Development Groups provided a further important source of expertise and advice. In carrying out their deliberations, the members of these representative structures have drawn on both national and international research, consultation findings and relevant government policy commitments.

Furthermore, in developing the curriculum, significant attention has been paid to ensuring that learning is age appropriate.

Decisions about what to include in the curriculum are evidence-based and informed by international best practice, as well as extensive consultations with parents/guardians, teachers. Students at Junior Cycle and Senior Cycle have a textbook for SPHE and while other teaching materials are also used, this is a helpful resource to help inform you of what they will be studying and discussing in SPHE. We begin the RSE modules in January for all year groups except Sixth Year who will cover this on a modular basis

throughout the year. However, teaching students about their sexuality, healthy relationships, inclusivity, and respect for everyone is an integral part of the SPHE programme and aspects of RSE will be taught and discussed throughout the year as part of the curriculum and in an age-appropriate manner.
